

## Juul is increasing in popularity among youth.

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Juul is one of the newer electronic smoking devices (aka: e-cigarettes).

Juul can be easily concealed (small, little smell, aerosol hidden) and use is referred to as “juuling.”

Teens usually will use Juul in areas away from school staff, but may also conceal use by blowing the aerosol (aka: vapor) down their shirt. There may be a light smell of the flavoring (ie: mango and others).

Juul looks like a long flash drive (left) and delivers high levels of nicotine (or possibly other drugs), leading to addiction.

The “e-juice” is in the pod (right), which snaps into the end of the Juul device.



Juul will heat the “e-juice” from the pod allowing the user to inhale the aerosol (aka: vapor).

Juul can be recharged by attaching the USB adapter and plugging it into any USB port.



Juul, like other similar devices, gives off carcinogens, toxins and fine particulate matter.

Studies are now showing us that use of such devices can create health problems for users.

Indoor use of such devices can also create a secondhand effect that can lead to health problems for bystanders.
